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Dr. Herman Hoeh Off to Holyland for Busy Summer

Off to Europe and the Middle East this past Sunday flew Dr. Herman L. Hoeh, Dean of Instruction at Ambassador College.

First stop was the sister college in Bricket Wood, where on June 28, he will be presented with Ambassador's first Doctor of Philosophy degree. Writing up to the last minute, Dr. Hoeh barely completed his 275-page thesis (Volume II of the Compendium on history) in time to pack and catch the 10 P.M. transatlantic BOAC flight.

After commencement, and also a short visit to the German office in Duesseldorf, Dr. Hoeh will head for Jerusalem and the main purpose of his trip. There he will attend an eightweek summer session at the foreign branch of Hebrew Union College. Included in his studies will be a two-week on-site archaeological expedition.

Dr. Hoeh plans to return around September 1. We hope that he comes back with a good amount of new knowledge and experience that can benefit the Church of God.

"Will there be audiences . . . the same challenges . . . eulogizing in the ages beyond . . . will there be a commencement address in 1975 at *Harvard?*" Mr. Armstrong gravely — challengingly asked!

He continued:

"People cry, SAVE US from this world we've produced!"—and "What is education DOING about it? Are educational institutions producing leaders for tomorrow?"

And how *well* we Ambassadors know the answer—as he so dramatically pointed out:

"The answer: NO—education is doing nothing!" It can do nothing! It has NO "new tools to solve the old problems of the world . . . it has handed students the problems—and told them there are NO answers!"

As Mr. Armstrong told us during those memorable moments, we at Ambassador KNOW why the world wallows in its problems—we know what the frightening future will dump into the laps of our people. We have the TOOLS to SOLVE the problems of the world today.

With these words ringing in their minds, THIRTY-SIX Ambassador students proudly received one of the highest awards given in this day and age—a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Ambassador College. Mr. Garner Ted Armstrong conducted the ceremony, presiding on behalf of Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong who was in Bricket Wood, England.

cause of its greater psychological appeal to the French-speaking world, there were simply too many obstacles in the way!

Prices were fantastic. Legal problems arose. We were assured the government (always none too secure) looked VERY critically at any "foreign" concerns, especially *religious* ones, setting up offices in Paris. They have the right to completely REVOKE their permission to operate as a business, *at any time!*

Circumstances showed God had CLOSED the door in Paris—but, upon arriving in Geneva, and searching for suitable spaces there, that He had flung WIDE the door in Switzerland!

Mr. Apartian found JUST THE RIGHT location, in a brand new building (actually not even totally completed as yet), ultra-modern, with spacious offices, providing a large "flat" or apartment for our first office staff, Mr. and Mrs. Colin Wilkins!

Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong left his tour of Europe with Mrs. Armstrong and the Coles to join Mr. Apartian in Geneva! He approved the spaces, then selected furnishings for the offices and the apartment! The new French offices will uphold in *every* way the fine offices of the Work of God around the world!

Laden with over 60 concept drawings of the proposed *new buildings* for *both* campuses, plus drawings showing proposed landscaping, pools, canals, bridges, shrubs, trees, proposed closure of streets, and the *whole* of the campus as it will *finally be*, the architects will

be seeking Mr. Armstrong's decisions on many important matters.

Messrs. Meredith, Hill Plan Summer Four-Continent Tour


Forty-nine days AROUND THE WORLD! This jet-powered schedule will whisk away two of God's ministers, Mr. Roderick C. Meredith and Mr. David Jon Hill, July 11.

The pair will visit FOUR CONTINENTS on the global fact-finding tour. The main purpose of the trip is to converse with natives on a grass-roots level with the hope of personal interviews, and to investigate world conditions firsthand. The background material thus obtained will be used in future PLAIN TRUTH articles and college classes.

After stopovers in Greece and Turkey the two will spend a *full month* in the ever-seething Middle East, visiting Egypt—focal point of the new UAR, Jerusalem—divided by a wall of hate like that in Berlin, and PETRA—ghost city of stone that may yet become a citadel of safety for God's people.

In late August Messrs. Meredith and Hill will visit the Orient—Pakistan, India, Singapore—the Philippines and Australia, returning to Pasadena on August 29th.
